**BIRMINGHAM JUSTICE & PEACE ASSEMBLY 2020: THE CLIMATE EMERGENCY:

This year the Assembly will take place ONLINE, with one-hour sessions over three evenings at 7.30pm: Monday 28 September, Wednesday 30 September, Friday 2 October and culminating with an Evening Prayer with the participation of Archbishop Bernard on Sunday 4 October at 7pm.

Sessions include: Ecological Conversion – an 'examination of conscience' on our care for our common home; Prepare the Future – building back better to address the climate emergency; and Local Government Responsibilities – planning for the West Midlands.

ATTENDING MASS - PLEASE READ ME BEFORE YOUR VISIT

- Both churches now have fogging machines. These have been bought by the generosity of two parishioners so thank you! This makes sanitization after mass both simpler and more effective.
- At St Rose you can book as a “bubble.” Simply add contact details for one person and add how many extra people will come with and sit with you at mass. Please add all visitors, children as well. A couple obviously will log details of one of you, and then simply add another.
- The PHE advice encourages parishioners to sit at the front of church first and fill backwards so that people are not walking past people already seated on and hogging the back row. Best of luck with that!
- Communion at St Rose will now be distributed by communicants coming to the front. However, you will of course need to socially distance as you do so and markers on the floor will make this quite clear.
- Given the restrictions introduced this week it has been decided to remain “as we are” at St Peter’s especially as this week the parish priest leaves for a break.
- Mass Intentions – These can still be requested.
- If you book online, you can see how many other places have been taken already. If you cannot see a booking for a mass scheduled this week, this is because it is now full. **Please do not just turn up!!!!**
- There will also be each day additional discretionary spaces for those without internet access, these must be booked by ringing the presbytery.
- Confession will usually be available before mass, again with restrictions on social interaction. **Please however book this with the parish priest.**
- There will not be a collection at mass, but a basket will be in church to place any offerings. These will be kept safe in church and subsequently banked.
- **Mass on Tuesday will be a “school mass.” Hopefully a very small handful of children will attend but each class at both schools will join in via Youtube. This is something we hope will feature every week as obviously at the moment it is not possible to invite the whole school at mass.**

BAPTISM PREPARATION

We have provisionally booked two dates now in early October for baptism preparation. This will take place on the 6th and 13th October inside St Rose at 7pm. All parents seeking baptism must book their places at these sessions. At the second session we will arrange dates. Obviously if circumstances evolve relating to the pandemic in Birmingham these dates may alter.
